**3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Rescissions Act of 5 2025".

## 6 SEC. 2. RESCISSIONS OF BUDGET AUTHORITY.

 immediately upon the date of enactment of this Act.
