Damaged Politically as Tory Support Wanes

LONDON - Prime Minist Boris Johnson survived a tense vote of no confidence on Monday, fending off a motiny that nevertheless leaves him reeling and presages a volatile period in British politics, as he fights to stay

in power and lead a divided Con-servative Party. The vote, 211 to 148, fell short of the majority of Tory lawmakers needed to oust Mr. Johnson. But it laid hare how hadly his support has eroded since last year, when a scandal erupted over revelations that he and his senior aides threw parties at 10 Downing Street that violated the government's lock-down rules. More than 40 percent of Conservative lawmakers voted against him in an unexpectedly

arge rebellion. Mr. Johnson vowed to stay on, declaring that the victory should put an end to months of speculaput an end to months of specua-tion about his future. "It's a con-vincing result, a decisive result," the prime minister said from Downing Street after the results of the secret ballot were an

"As a government," Mr. Johnson added, "we can focus and move on to the stuff that really matters to

History shows, however, that Conservative prime ministers who have been subjected to such a who have been subjected to such a vote — even if they win it — are usually drummed out of office, if not immediately then within a few

Mr. Johnson won a smaller Mr. Johnson won a smaller share of his party's support on Monday than either his predeces-sor, Theresa May, did in 2018, or Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher did in 1990, when they survived no-confidence votes. Mrs. May was forced out six months later. Mrs. Thatcher lasted only a few days.

SVIATOHIRSK, Ukraine - Of he hundreds of battle sites all cross Ukraine, the Sviatohirsk fonastery of the Caves surely ranks among the most incongru

The sprawling complex of on-ion-domed churches built into a high bank of the Siversky Donets River is considered one of the five holiest sites in the Russian Ortho-dox Church. Yet it is directly in the line of fire of the Russian Army in its advance in eastern Ukraine.

ARMS EXPERIENCE PRESENTS HURDLE IN UKRAINE FIGHT

SOPHISTICATED WEAPONS

Soldiers Need Instruction on the Tools of War From the West

KHERSON REGION, Ukrain Since Russia invaded, NATO nations have upgraded Ukraine's arsenal with increasingly sophis-ticated tools, with more promised, like the advanced multiple-launch rocket systems pledged by the United States and Britain.

But training soldiers how to use the equipment has become a sig-nificant and growing obstacle — one encountered daily by Junior Sgt. Dmytro Pysanka and his crew, operating an aged antitank underbrush in southern

Peering through the sight attached to the gun, Sergeant Pysanka is greeted with a kaleidorysankan greece win a subsus-scope of numbers and lines that, if read correctly, should give him the calculations needed to fire at Rus-sian forces. However, errors are mmon in the chaos of battle.

More than a month ago, the owner than a month ago, the commanders of his frentline artil-lery unit secured a far more ad-vanced tool: a high-tech, Western-supplied laser range finder to help ith targeting. But there's a hitch: Nobody

"It's like being given an iPhone 13 and only being able to make phone calls," said Sergeant Pysanka, clearly exasperated.

The range finder, high-tech bin-oculars called JIM LR, is likely part of the tranche of equipment supplied by the United States. Sergeant Pysanka said.

It may seem like a perfect choice to help make better use of the antitank gun, built in 1985. It can see targets at night and trans mit their distance, compass heading and GPS coordinates. Some soldiers learned enough to oper-ate the tool, but then rotated else-where in recent days, leaving the unit with an expensive paper

"I have been trying to learn how to use it by reading the manual in English and using Google Translate to understand it," Sergeant On Monday, Britain promised to
