He has been an assistant district attorney in Cameron County, justice of the peace, and served as a judge until 2010. He was elected as County Commissioner for Cameron County in 2011 and served through 2016. He has dedicated his life and education to serving others. Sanchez believes that the people of South Texas need a strong leader who will advocate for them in Washington, D.C., while not missing a beat. He has demonstrated his strong leadership and is ready to continue to serve Texas' 34th congressional district.
