



2022 E-PAC SUCCESS

With less than 50 days from Election Day, GOP women are poised to build on the historic success of the 2020 cycle, when E-PAC led the charge to more than DOUBLE the number of Republican women in Congress to the highest number ever in our nation's history. Following successful candidate recruitment and a record number of GOP women filed to run for Congress in 2022:

- The majority of 2022's E-PAC endorsed GOP women won their primaries
- Three of 2022's E-PAC endorsed GOP women have already been sworn into Congress
- There are 22 E-PAC endorsed GOP women in open and challenger races running in the general election

MOST DIVERSE GOP WOMEN CANDIDATES TO DATE

This cycle includes the most diverse group of E-PAC endorsed candidates to date. These women come from all different walks of life, and many are veterans, health care leaders, small business owners, and mothers.

Hispanic GOP Women: Mayra Flores (TX-34), Monica De La Cruz (TX-15), Cassy Garcia (TX-28), Anna Paulina Luna (FL-13), Lori Chavez-DeRemer (OR-05), Catalina Lauf (IL-11) and Yesli Vega (VA-07). These women are on the frontlines of gaining historic GOP support from Hispanic voters.

Veterans: Jennifer-Ruth Green (IN-01), Anna Paulina Luna (FL-13), Esther Joy King (IL-15), and Jen Kiggans (VA-02).

GOP WOMEN ARE KEY TO THE HOUSE MAJORITY

Nearly 1 in 4 of the NRCC's targeted races have a GOP woman nominee. Of all 2022 open and challenger races, five GOP women are running in seats that President Donald Trump won in 2020. More than a dozen women are running in districts that Joe Biden won by 10 points or less, and of these target seats, five of them are districts that President Trump won in 2016.

RECORD FUNDRAISING AND SUPPORT

Since its founding, E-PAC has raised and donated over \$4 million for GOP women candidates, this includes cycle-to-date more than \$1,000,000 directly to GOP women candidates including through WinRed. E-PAC has also helped book more than 100 national TV interviews for candidates and worked with campaigns to execute earned media hits in their districts and strengthen their grassroots campaigns.

BUILDING ON HISTORIC SUCCESS

Congresswoman Stefanik founded E-PAC to recruit and elect more GOP women following the 2018 elections when only 13 Republican women served in the House of Representatives, making up just 2.9% of Congress.

E-PAC has since built a proven track record of success. In 2020, 11 out of the 15 seats that Republicans flipped were won by E-PAC endorsed Republican women. President Trump and the media deemed 2020 "The Year of the Republican Women."

Now, we're only five seats away from the House majority. There are currently 34 Republican women elected to Congress. If every E-PAC endorsed GOP woman won, there would be more than 50 GOP women in the 118th Congress. Thanks to E-PAC, in 2020, GOP women were history makers and in 2022, GOP women will be the Majority Makers.
