Methodology



Public Opinion Survey

- N=148 respondents
- Survey of Capitol Hill chiefs of staff, legislative directors, communications directors, press secretaries, and staff directors
- Conducted online by LSG June 3-21, 2024

Summary of Key Findings



A plurality report that the member of Congress they work for **OPPPOSES** the House Agriculture Committee's \$1.5 trillion farm bill proposal, which most believe is **UNLIKELY** to pass.



Nearly half – including a majority of Republican senior staffers – report that the member they work for **SUPPORTS** the Biden Administration imposing new tariffs on Chinese-made products.



A majority of Democratic senior staffers report that their member **SUPPORTS** Biden's handling of the Israel-Hamas war, while most GOP senior staffers report the member they work for **OPPOSES** it.



A majority of senior staffers still believe **Tim SCOTT** is most likely to be former President Trump's running mate in 2024, followed by **JD Vance**, **Doug Burgum**, and **Marco Rubio**.



Most senior staffers in both parties believe **DEMOCRATS** will win the Senate races in **AZ**, **PA**, and **WI**, while senior staffers are **SPLIT** by party on who will win in **MD**, **MT**, **NV**, and **OH**.

Legislative Issues

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Senior staffers are SPLIT on whether Rep. Mike Johnson is EFFECTIVE as speaker of the House




