BY THE NUMBERS

---

- More than **92%** of the GOP members included in this guidebook are **election deniers**.
- **100%** of the incumbent GOP members included in this guidebook **voted against creating an independent commission to investigate the Jan. 6 attack on the U.S. Capitol**.



- **100%** of the incumbent GOP members included in this guidebook **endorsed Trump**, as did at least **85%** of the incoming freshman in this guidebook.
- The incumbent GOP members included in this guidebook all voted with Trump more than **77%** of the time and some members—including Kevin McCarthy, Steve Scalise, Lauren Boebert, and Marjorie Taylor Greene—**voted with Trump more than 97% of the time**.
- **90%** of the GOP members in this guidebook **support banning abortion**, and **76%** of the incumbent GOP members included in this guidebook co-sponsored a national abortion ban **with no exceptions for rape or incest**.

## KEY FACTS:

- Called QAnon “a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to take this global cabal of Satan-worshiping pedophiles out.”<sup>2</sup>
- Called abortion “mass genocide” and supports abortion bans.<sup>3</sup>
- Liked comments on social media in support for executing prominent Democrats:
  - “HANG that bitch!”
  - “These Traitors need to be put to death as an example of what will no longer be tolerated in this country!!!”<sup>4</sup>
- Claimed that ‘Jewish space lasers’ are responsible for wildfires.<sup>5</sup>
- Agreed with comments on Facebook claiming that the Parkland, Sandy Hook, and Las Vegas shootings were staged.<sup>6 7 8</sup>

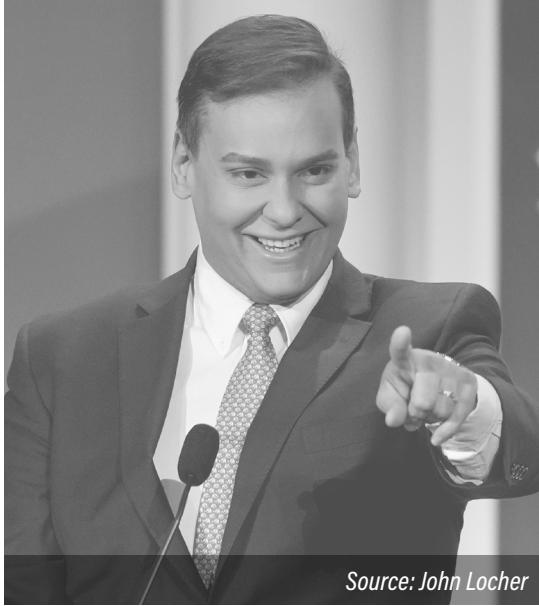

## KEY FACTS:

- Says he’s the “embodiment of the American dream,” but his “resume appears to be largely fiction” and he has “misrepresented a number of his career highlights.”<sup>10</sup>
- Attended the January 6th rally in DC, calling it a “front-row spectacle” of an “amazing” event and compared the actions of the January 6th attackers to “breaking into your own house and being charged for trespassing.”<sup>11</sup>
- Attended a New York GOP gala event with white supremacists and QAnon conspiracy theorists. At the same event, Marjorie Taylor Greene said that if she organized the January 6 attack on the Capitol, they “would have won” and “would have been armed.”<sup>12</sup>
- Expressed doubt about stories of rape survivors who seek abortions, and said that he wants to “eradicate” all abortions without “proven police documentation.”<sup>13</sup>

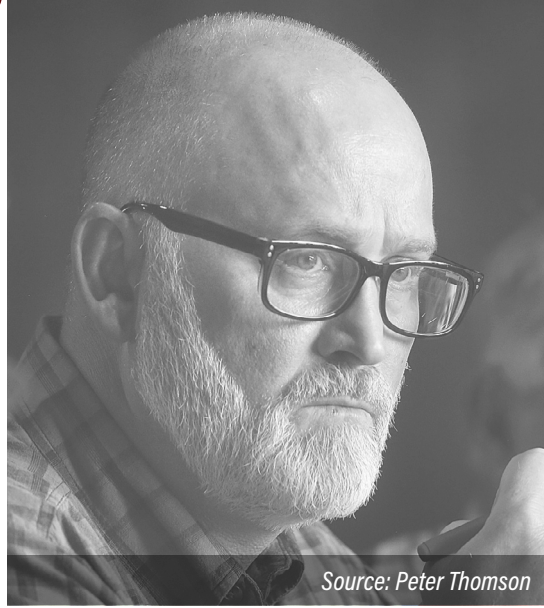

## KEY FACTS:

- Breached police barricades at the US Capitol on January 6th to “stand up for electoral integrity.”<sup>15</sup>
- Called COVID–19 relief a “disaster” and “wasteful,” but a nonprofit he works with and a business he co–owned received hundreds of thousands of dollars in relief funding.<sup>16 17</sup>
- Supports banning abortion even in cases of rape or incest and said that “life begins at conception” and the number of abortions in the U.S. amounts to “genocide.”<sup>18</sup>

## KEY FACTS:

- Met with Kyle Rittenhouse, who shot and killed two people at a protest against police brutality in Kenosha, WI in 2020.<sup>20</sup>
- Campaigned with MAGA extremist Marjorie Taylor Greene, and has praised Greene, Jim Jordan, Lauren Boebert, and other Freedom Caucus members as “incredible thought leaders.”<sup>21</sup>
- Believes Trump won the election and attended the premiere of Dinesh D’Souza’s “2000 Mules,” a debunked documentary that falsely claims to show evidence of widespread voter fraud in the 2020 election.<sup>22</sup>
- Ran for Congress with the support of the campaign arm of the House Freedom Caucus.<sup>23</sup>

**KEY FACTS:**

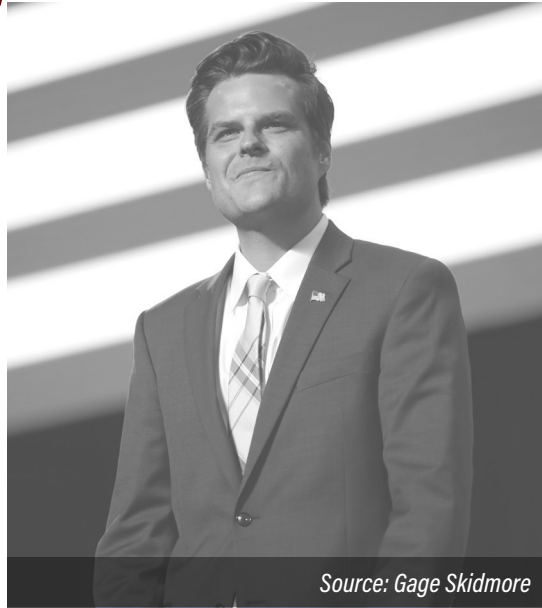
- Attended a New York GOP gala event with white supremacists and QAnon conspiracy theorists. The same event where MAGA extremists Marjorie Taylor Greene made pro-insurrectionist comments — explaining that if she organized the January 6 attack on the Capitol, they “would have won” and “would have been armed.”<sup>25</sup>
  - Hired a chief of staff with a criminal history of battery and felony criminal damage who was recently arrested for kicking a dog with his boot.<sup>26</sup>
  - Ran for Congress with the support of the campaign arm of the House Freedom Caucus.<sup>27</sup>
  - Called the Jan 6th insurrectionists “political prisoners” who are being “held for nonviolent crimes” and an effort to “suppress law-abiding citizens from expressing their first amendment rights.”<sup>28</sup>
- Handwritten notes:* “5 people died” with an arrow pointing to “political prisoners”; “law-breaking” with an arrow pointing to “suppress law-abiding citizens...”





## KEY FACTS:

- Co-sponsored a national abortion ban with no exceptions for rape or incest that would imprison doctors for up to five years if they violated the law.<sup>31</sup>
- After the January 6th insurrection, Gaetz claimed the attackers were “masquerading as Trump supporters and, in fact, were members of the violent terrorist group Antifa.” Voted against creating an independent commission to investigate the Jan. 6th insurrection.<sup>32</sup>
- Said “LGBT rights groups should focus less on protecting abortion access because lesbians are more likely to adopt children than to be victims of rape.”<sup>33</sup>

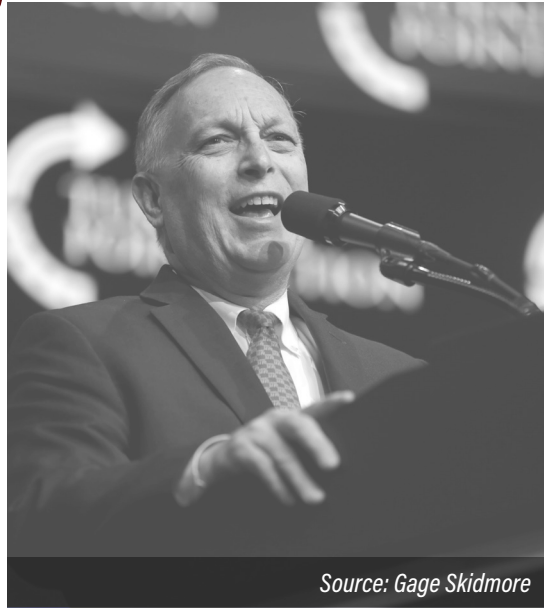

## KEY FACTS:

- Opposed to the separation of church and state and called the separation “junk.”<sup>35</sup>
- Appeared to have advocated for violence against lawmakers during the January 6th attack and even tweeted out information about some lawmakers’ locations during the attack.<sup>36</sup> *doxxed her coworkers*
- Asked Jewish visitors at the U.S. Capitol if they were there to perform “reconnaissance.”<sup>37</sup>
- Boebert introduced a resolution to impeach President Biden, and also co-sponsored resolutions to impeach DHS Secretary Mayorkas and Secretary of State Blinken.<sup>38</sup>

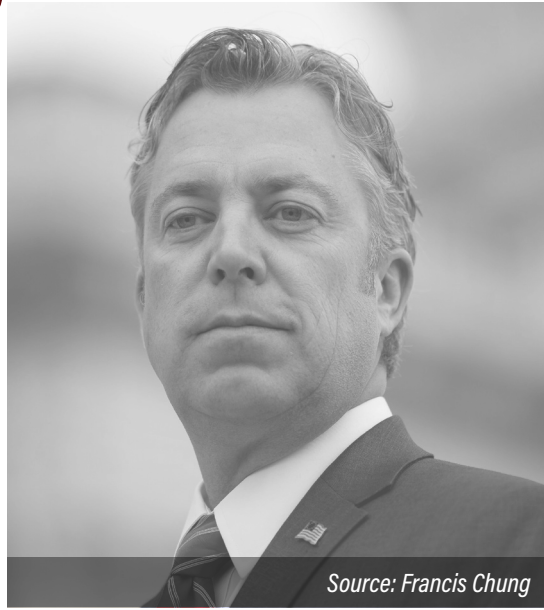
## LEADERSHIP ROLE:

Former Chair of the House Freedom Caucus

## KEY FACTS:

- Voted to overturn the election results in 2020 and pressured Arizona politicians to decertify Arizona’s electors. He is even linked to the organizers of the January 6th insurrection and allegedly asked Trump for a presidential pardon for his Jan. 6 involvement.<sup>41</sup>
- Lead sponsor of a resolution calling for the impeachment of Homeland Security Secretary Mayorkas and co-sponsored impeachment resolutions against others including President Biden and Attorney General Garland.<sup>42</sup>
- Spoke at an event where one of the founders of the Oath Keepers called for hanging Senator John McCain.<sup>43</sup>
- Co-sponsored anti-abortion bills with no exception for rape or incest, which could have imprisoned doctors, made abortion murder, and impacted contraception access.<sup>44</sup>

## KEY FACTS:

- Said that rape and incest exceptions for abortion laws were being used to address “red herrings” used by “the left and radicals.”<sup>46</sup>
- Advocated for defunding the Department of Education.<sup>47</sup>
- MAGA extremist who has already called for the impeachment of President Biden and Vice President Harris, as well as for treason charges against the Secretary of the Department of Homeland Security.<sup>48</sup>
- Ran for Congress with the support of the campaign arm of the House Freedom Caucus.<sup>49</sup>





AGAINST  
THE LAW

KEY FACTS:

- Introduced anti-evolution bills that would allow public school teachers to tie lessons to the Bible and question evolution.<sup>51</sup>
- Urged states to find creative ways to defy the Supreme Court ruling that allowed same sex marriage and advocated to transform Oklahoma into a “sanctuary” to protect marriage between heterosexuals only.<sup>52</sup>
- Campaign had the support of the House Freedom Caucus. Freedom Caucus co-founder and MAGA extremist Jim Jordan even cut a campaign ad for Brecheen.<sup>53</sup>
- Endorsed by David Barton, a fervent homophobe and supporter of removing Martin Luther King Jr. from history books.<sup>54</sup>

## KEY FACTS:

- Campaigned with a white supremacist who defended segregation and cast doubt on the Holocaust.<sup>56</sup>
- Censured and removed from committee assignments after posting a video depicting him murdering a congresswoman and attacking President Biden.<sup>57</sup>
- Defended Jan. 6 insurrectionists, or as he calls them, “peaceful patriots”, and voted against the January 6 Commission.<sup>58</sup>
- Member of the Republican Study Committee, a group proposing a “blueprint to save America” that includes significant spending cuts, including cuts to Social Security and Medicare.<sup>59</sup>





## KEY FACTS:

- Accused of domestic abuse by Stephanie Grisham, a former Trump White House press secretary and communications director.<sup>60</sup>
- Helped plan the January 6th rally, which led to the insurrection on the Capitol.<sup>61</sup>
- Allegedly lied on his LinkedIn about being a US Marine Corps recruiter.<sup>62</sup>

## KEY FACTS:

*Found in violation of the constitution for attending an event in Russia with Putin.<sup>67</sup>*

- Endorsed by former general Mike Flynn, a prominent QAnon conspiracist.<sup>63</sup>
- Said that one of the top challenges facing his district were “drag queen shows,” despite the DFW metropolitan area facing some of the highest inflation in the country.<sup>64 65</sup>
- Supports banning abortion with no exceptions for rape or incest. He even said, “the sonogram is the greatest tool in our fight against the barbarism and child sacrifice of the abortion industry.”<sup>66</sup>

## KEY FACTS:

- Espouses conspiracy theories, including that the COVID-19 pandemic is part of a grand plan orchestrated by the global elite, saying, “My Spidy senses, started going insane when COVID lock downs and related insanity started.”<sup>70</sup>
- Supports banning abortion (even in cases of rape or incest) and allowing states to punish patients and doctors.<sup>71</sup>
- Was scheduled to speak at a rally in support of the January 6th attackers alongside white nationalists who endorse Nazi ideology.<sup>72</sup>
- Shared an article titled “the Great Reset is not a conspiracy theory” on Facebook.<sup>73</sup>
- Said he is being mentored by Freedom Caucus members and plans to work closely with them in Congress.<sup>74</sup>

## KEY FACTS:

- Was an early investor in Gab, a social media platform used by white nationalists, neo-Nazis, and members of militias, many of which were banned from mainstream platforms.<sup>76</sup>
- Worked closely with Brian Talbert, supporter of the Proud Boys, founder of “Deplorable Pride,” and anti-Muslim activist.<sup>77</sup>
- Agreed that the LGBTQ+ movement was the “Taliban.”<sup>78</sup>

*This from the guy who wants to lead the Homeland Security Committee*





## KEY FACTS:

- Signed onto a letter to Dr. Fauci inquiring about “effective” countermeasures to COVID-19 including ivermectin and hydroxychloroquine.<sup>80</sup> *aka not scientifically proven*
- Co-sponsored 4 different *proven* resolutions to impeach Biden as well as impeachment resolutions against DHS Secretary Mayorkas, AG Garland, and SOS Blinken.<sup>81</sup>
- An election denier who tweeted “President @realDonaldTrump received hundreds of thousands of legal votes more, in all the Swing States, than his corrupt opponent. ALL Data shows that it was impossible for him to lose, unless FIXED!”<sup>82</sup>

- Promoted and defended Iowa's disastrous Medicaid privatization, which illegally denied care, delayed reimbursements, and failed to help Iowans afford healthcare.<sup>84</sup>
- Accepted campaign cash from a Chinese government-owned company's PAC, and opposed legislation that would bolster America's ability to compete with China and bring manufacturing jobs and supply chains back from overseas.<sup>85 86</sup>
- Voted for a 6 week abortion ban in Iowa and indicated in a primary debate that he supported abortion bans with no exceptions.<sup>87</sup>



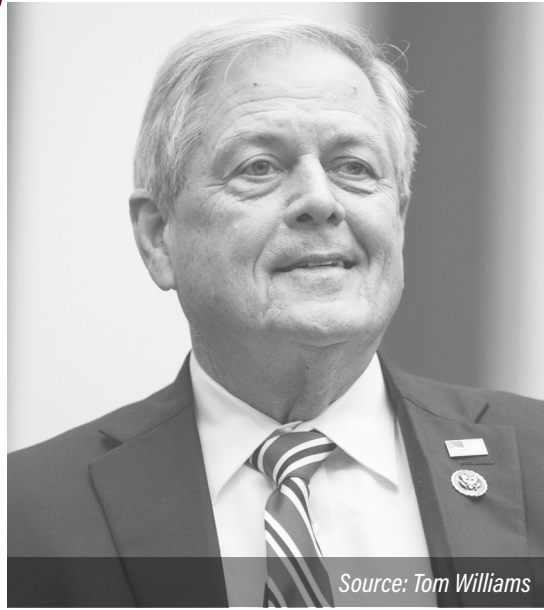

## KEY FACTS:

- Advocated for the President to invoke martial law to overturn the results of the 2020 election, texting Trump’s Chief of Staff, “we are at a point of ‘no return’ in saving our Republic !! Our LAST HOPE is invoking ~~Marshall~~ Law!! PLEASE URGE TO PRESIDENT TO DO SO!!”<sup>89</sup>

MARTIAL

- Voted against a resolution to condemn QAnon after adherents of the conspiracy theory sent death threats to Democratic members.<sup>90</sup>  
*These were his coworkers!*
- One of 21 members of the House who voted against awarding the Congressional Gold Medal to the Capitol Police after January 6th.<sup>91</sup>
- Part of a small group that pushed to reinstate Rep. Steve King on committees after King was removed from his assignments for making racist remarks.<sup>92</sup>

- Tried to overturn the 2020 elections by sharing conspiracy videos from Romania with the White House and pressuring the Georgia Secretary of State.<sup>93</sup>
- Supports banning abortion with no exceptions for rape or incest, and with punishment for doctors.<sup>94</sup>
- Read a Biblical passage at a 2016 Republican conference meeting that said LGBTQ people “are worthy of death.”<sup>95</sup>

## KEY FACTS:

- Co-sponsored a “fetal personhood” bill that would make abortion murder and could impact contraception access.<sup>96</sup>
- On the steering committee of the Republican Study Committee, which is proposing significant spending cuts to Social Security and Medicare.<sup>97</sup>

- Introduced a House Resolution calling on Republicans to not call on Trump to concede after losing the 2020 election.<sup>101</sup>

**KEY FACTS:**

- Refused to comply with a subpoena from the January 6 committee regarding his alleged attempt to install an election denier as Attorney General in the hopes that the election results would be overturned.<sup>103</sup>
- One of just 6 members of the House who voted against a bill intended to collect, analyze, and preserve evidence of Russian war crimes in Ukraine.<sup>104</sup>
- Compared the Democratic Party to the Nazi Party.<sup>105</sup>
- Voted against a resolution to condemn QAnon after adherents of the conspiracy theory sent death threats to a sitting member of Congress.<sup>106</sup>

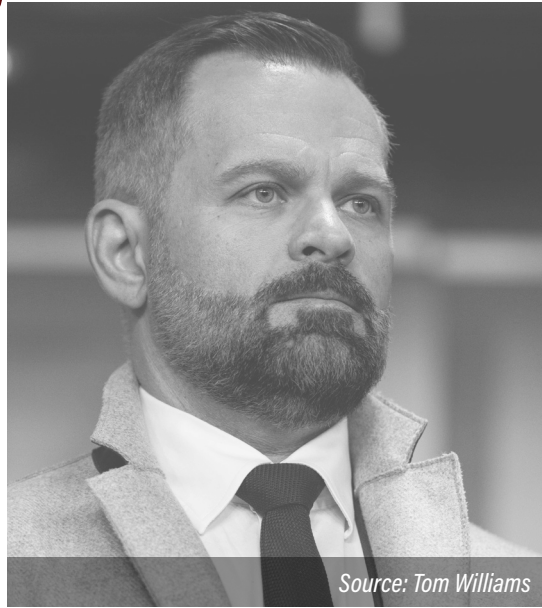
### KEY FACTS:

- Claimed that she and Trump had their election victories “stolen” due to “massive voter fraud and ballot harvesting,” yet there was no evidence of such.<sup>107</sup>
- Supports an extreme abortion ban with no exceptions for rape or incest and will allow states to put doctors in jail for providing abortion services.<sup>108</sup>

### KEY FACTS:

- Voted in favor of spending \$70 million in taxpayer money on a “forensic audit” of the 2020 election in Virginia, where there was no evidence of widespread voter fraud.<sup>109</sup>
- Dismissed reproductive rights and called abortion a “shiny object” that isn’t an issue “voters really care about.”<sup>110</sup>

## KEY FACTS:

- Called student debt relief a “socialist bailout” and said that “no hard working American should be responsible for loans they didn’t take out,” yet accepted more than \$1 million in PPP loans that were forgiven.<sup>112</sup> *...he got a bailout.*
- Mills attended a New York GOP gala event with white supremacists and QAnon conspiracy theorists. At the same event, Marjorie Taylor Greene said that if she organized the January 6 attack on the Capitol, they “would have won” and “would have been armed.”<sup>113</sup>
- Denies the results of the 2020 election.<sup>114</sup>





## KEY FACTS:

- Resigned as Trump’s Secretary of Interior due to an “avalanche of investigations into his conduct” after breaking ethics rules and abusing his office and government resources for two years.<sup>115</sup>
- His wife declared primary residence in California in tax-filing while he is a Montana representative.<sup>116</sup> *Where’s Waldo Zinke*
- Denies the 2020 election results and refuses to acknowledge that President Joe Biden was legitimately elected.<sup>117</sup>

- Called on the Supreme Court to overturn the results of the 2020 election.<sup>121</sup>
- Co-sponsored a national abortion ban with no exceptions for rape or incest. He also co-sponsored a “fetal personhood” bill that would make abortion murder and could impact contraception access.

- Voted to overturn the election results in 2020, said Trump played no role in inciting the insurrection, and opposed creating a committee to investigate January 6.<sup>124</sup>
- Co-sponsored a national abortion ban and a “fetal personhood” bill, and voted against the right to contraception, including birth control and condoms.<sup>125</sup>

## KEY FACTS:

- Defended Trump’s false claim that the 2020 election was stolen to win votes for Speaker of the House.<sup>128</sup>
- Heavily invested in his relationship with Marjorie Taylor Greene—who believes in ‘Jewish Space Lasers’—and continues to cave to Greene and the MAGA wing on investigations and committee assignments.<sup>129</sup>
- MAGA leaders including Trump and Marjorie Taylor Greene whipped MAGA votes in support of McCarthy for Speaker.<sup>130</sup>
- Indicated that Republicans would consider using programs like Social Security and Medicare as political bargaining chips around a potential debt ceiling fight.<sup>131</sup>
