Methodology



Public Opinion Survey


- N=118 respondents
- Survey of Capitol Hill chiefs of staff, legislative directors, communications directors, press secretaries, and staff directors
- Conducted online by LSG February 5-23, 2024



Summary of Key Findings

- Most Capitol Hill senior staffers including a majority of Republicans believe Mike Johnson is INEFFECTIVE as speaker of the House.
- Most accurately **PREDICTED** that 2024 would be Sen. Mitch McConnell's final year as Senate Republican leader, and they believe that Sen. John Thune is **MOST** likely to succeed him.
- Most senior staffers believe the bipartisan tax package is LIKELY to pass, while nearly all believe the bipartisan Senate border security and immigration package is UNLIKELY to pass.
- Senior staffers believe immigration, inflation/rising cost of living, the economy, and abortion will be MOST the important issues to voters as they consider who to vote for in this year's elections.
- Most senior staffers believe Joe Biden will WIN re-election this year, and the vast majority believe REPUBLICANS will take control of the Senate, while DEMOCRATS will flip the House.





Legislative Issues

The vast majority of senior Capitol Hill staffers believe Rep. Mike Johnson is INEFFECTIVE as speaker of the House

If President Biden is not the Democratic nominee, who is most likely to be the party's nominee for president in 2024? (COMBINED CHOICE – TOP TWO)






