LEGISLATIVE UPDATES

Most (79%) believe Congress will NOT pass all 12 appropriations bills before the end of the fiscal year.

Almost all (91%) say Congress is UNLIKELY to pass legislation requiring the Supreme Court to adopt a stricter code of ethics or more substantial disclosure requirements.

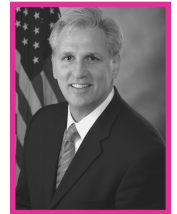


Support for BANNING TikTok in the United States is much stronger among Republican members (73%) than Democratic ones (38%).

AROUND THE HILL

A majority (54%) believe Democrats will come out of the debt limit negotiations STRONGER than Republicans.

Most (85%) believe Speaker McCarthy has been MORE effective than they initially believed after winning the speakership.



Few Democrats (14%) report the member they work for believes Sen. Feinstein SHOULD serve her full term but nearly half (48%) believe she WILL end up serving it.

THE 2024 OUTLOOK

A plurality of Republican senior staffers believe Governor DeSantis' feud with Disney will HELP him in the 2024 Republican presidential primary, and an overwhelming majority (85%) still believe DeSantis is most likely to be the GOP nominee for president if Trump does not win. On the other hand, most Democratic senior staffers (88%) believe it is UNLIKELY that any prominent elected Democratic lawmakers will challenge Biden for the 2024 nomination. The vast majority (79%) still AGREE that President Biden is the party's best option for winning in 2024.

METHODOLOGY:

- Anonymous survey of n=146 Capitol Hill chiefs of staff, legislative directors, communications directors, press secretaries, and staff directors
- Fielded online by LSG June 5-26, 2023

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
