

## SUMMARY: Draft Proposal AINS for H. Res. 1027 (Discharge Rule)

## **DEFENDING BORDERS, DEFENDING DEMOCRACIES ACT**

START: Text of <u>H.R. 7372</u>, <u>Defending Borders</u>, <u>Defending Democracies Act</u>

**TECHNICAL:** Removes option for Mexico to decline to accept expelled migrants

## **INSERT:**

- \$4.62 billion for Dept. of Homeland Security to implement border authorities
  - \$3.08 billion for Immigration & Customs Enforcement
  - \$1.48 billion for Customs & Border Patrol
  - \$56 million for Federal Law Enforcement Training Centers
- Text of <u>H.R. 815: National Security Act (Senate Supplemental)</u>
  - Additional \$28.22 billion, including:
    - \$7.1 billion for the Foreign Military Financing Program
    - \$5.65 billion for international disaster (humanitarian) assistance
    - \$400 million for the Nonprofit Security Grant program
    - \$281 million for submarine infrastructure modernization
    - \$100 million for demining in Ukraine
  - Also includes the FEND OFF Fentanyl Act, enhances stockpile and drawdown authorities, requires the Administration to report on a strategy for U.S. support for Ukraine amidst Russia's aggression, and prohibits any U.S. funding for UNWRA.
- Presidential Loan Authority Provision for Department of State Funding
  - Requires funds provided by the State Department directly to foreign governments be considered as a zero-interest loan, revocable or forgivable by the President if it is in the national interest of the U.S.
- Reauthorization of the Ukraine Democracy Defense Lend-Lease Act
  - Stipulates that lend-lease shall be used as applicable but shall not conflict or interfere with Presidential Drawdown Authority
- REPO for Ukrainians Act (as amended)
