RE: PRESIDENT TRUMP'S ENDORSEMENT POSITIONS MCKINNEY FOR THE WIN IN WASHINGTON'S 4th CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICT

DATE: FEBRUARY 20, 2026

In a recent survey of likely primary voters in Washington's 4th Congressional district (see methodology statement on last page), Fabrizio, Lee & Associates found that in a district that will almost certainly elect a Republican, Amanda McKinney already has a lead among GOP candidates despite most voters being unaware of President Trump's endorsement of her. Once WA-4 primary voters learn that the President has given McKinney his full and total support, she surges on the ballot and becomes the clear frontrunner.

WA CD-4 is a Deep Red District that a Republican Will Win

Washington's 4th Congressional district is a ruby red area in a dark blue state. In a generic Congressional district, primary voters in CD-4 chose a Republican by a more than 20-point margin, 56% - 35%, with 8% undecided. If the runoff comes down to a Republican and a Democrat, it is almost certain the GOP candidate will come out on top.

McKinney Leads Among all Republicans, while Duresky Monopolizes the Small Dem Vote

The lone Democrat in the race for WA CD-4, John Duresky, wins a plurality of the primary vote, but with only 25%. However, Amanda McKinney is in a close second with 20% of the vote, beating out the other Republican candidates -- Jerrod Sessler (14%), Matt Boehnke (7%) and Wesley Meier (1%). Independent Devin Poore pulls in 5%, all other candidates combine for 1%, and 27% are undecided. Most notably, McKinney has a lead on Sessler for 2nd place even though he is known to significantly more voters.

Fully 39% of WA CD-4 Voters are Aware that President Trump has Endorsed McKinney

Currently, 39% of primary voters already know that POTUS has endorsed and fully supports Amanda McKinney for Congress. A significant 22% of the electorate incorrectly believe Sessler has been endorsed by the President. More than a third of the primary voters believe he has endorsed no one or are unaware of who President Trump is endorsing.

Once Voters Learn More About McKinney, Including the Trump Endorsement, She Wins Big

After providing these voters with several messages about Amanda McKinney, including the fact that she has been endorsed and is fully supported by President Trump, her share of the vote doubles from 20% to 40%. She beats Duresky by 14-points, and more importantly, beats Sessler, Boehnke, and all the other Republicans in the race by more than 30-points. Once voters learn more about Amanda McKinney, she gains an essentially insurmountable lead and cannot be caught.

METHODOLOGY STATEMENT: Fabrizio, Lee & Associates conducted a survey of 400 likely primary voters in Washington’s 4th Congressional district from February 4-5, 2026. The interviews were split 40% live-operator cell phone/15% live-operator landline/45% SMS to web. Gender, age, race/ethnicity, party, and education were matched to demographic profiles of likely primary voters based on the voter file and exit polls. Respondents were randomly selected from lists of voters who either voted in at least 1 of the past 4 primaries or have registered to vote since the last primary. The margin of sampling error at the 95% confidence interval is ±4.9%.
