

Committee	Date	House instruction	Challenges
Agriculture	Week of May 5	Cut at least \$230 billion	Ag's jurisdiction includes SNAP. Some Republicans are antsy about cuts to the food stamp program. Democrats will likely make this a focal point as the committee moves toward a markup.
Armed Services	Week of April 28	Spend up to \$100 billion	The budget resolution gives the Senate panel up to \$150 billion to spend. Defense hawks are pushing for the higher sum.
Education and Workforce	Likely week of April 28	Cut at least \$330 billion	Ed and Workforce has floated cuts to student loan programs. CHC members have specifically warned against targeting Pell Grants for cuts.
Energy and Commerce	May 7	Cut at least \$880 billion	E&C has purview over Medicaid. It's almost impossible to meet the House target without massive cuts to Medicaid spending, a huge political problem for Republicans. The Senate instructions don't require any Medicaid cuts.
Financial Services	April 30	Cut at least \$1 billion	Most financial agencies return revenue to the government and tend to be funded by industry fees. But lawmakers think they can shrink the budget of the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau by targeting its percentage funding from the Federal Reserve.
Homeland Security	Week of April 28	Spend up to \$90 billion	The Senate committees tasked with new border security funding have different targets than the House.
